

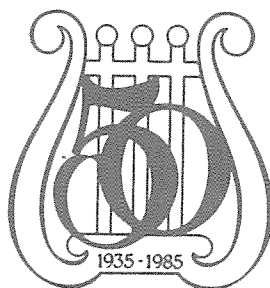

Stephen Shipps - Director

About the Conductor

Stephen Shipps was trained at Indiana University where his main conducting teacher was Keith Brown. He began his professional career as a conductor at the Music Academy of the West in 1976. In 1977 he was a finalist in the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra competition for Associate Conductor. In 1978 he was named Associate Conductor of the Omaha Symphony Orchestra and Nebraska Sinfonia, a position he held for three seasons. In that time he also conducted at the Festival of a Thousand Oaks, at the University of Nebraska and at festivals in Michigan conducting members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

In 1980 Mr. Shipps was named to the conducting staff at the North Carolina School of the Arts and its International Music Program. He conducted hundreds of concerts of the International Music Program in major European centers such as Berlin, Frankfurt, Bonn, Stuttgart, Milan, Siena, Florence and Spoleto. He conducted all ensembles of the North Carolina School of the Arts including a long relationship with the School of Ballet. In recent seasons he has guest conducted the Winston-Salem and Charlotte Symphonies in North Carolina and is appearing this season at Indiana University with violin virtuoso Yuval Yaron. Mr. Shipps has a great interest in American popular music and has conducted shows for such greats as Doc Severinsen, Billy Taylor and Anna Maria Alberghetti. In 1989, he was named to the faculty of the University of Michigan School of Music. Mr. Shipps is dividing his time between the North Carolina School of the Arts and the University of Michigan this year.

About the Conductor

Dr. Andre Thomas is Associate Professor of Music Education (choral) at Florida State University, Tallahassee. In his duties at Florida State, Dr. Thomas conducts the University Singers, Madrigal Singers and Opera Chorus, and also teaches choral conducting. In addition, he conducts the Tallahassee Community Chorus. A sought-after guest conductor and adjudicator of choral festivals and clinics, he received his D.M.A. in choral conducting from the University of Illinois. An accomplished composer and arranger, he is published by the Hinshaw Music Company, Mark Foster Music Company and Fitzsimons Music Company.

Larry Rachleff - Conductor

About the Conductor

Larry Rachleff is the newly appointed Music Director and Conductor of Wind Ensembles and Chamber Orchestra at The University of Southern California. As Associate Professor of Music, Professor Rachleff will also teach courses in advanced graduate conducting and repertoire. Previously, Professor Rachleff was Coordinator of Instrumental Ensembles at the Oberlin Conservatory; Music Director of Wind Ensemble and Contemporary Music Ensemble; and a frequent conductor of the Oberlin Orchestras. Under his direction these ensembles received critical acclaim, most recently by the New York Times for their "passionate, polished, sparkling" performances. The Contemporary Ensemble also began a recording project with Opus One records. In the summer of 1988 Professor Rachleff conducted throughout the United States and the Soviet Union with the American Soviet Youth Orchestra, an ensemble co-sponsored by the Oberlin Conservatory of Music and The American Field Services. This unique ensemble was comprised of the most gifted university/conservatory students from the USSR and the United States. This past summer Professor Rachleff was in residence as a guest conductor at the Tanglewood Institute and The National Music Camp, Interlochen, Michigan.

Prior to his position at The University of Southern California, Professor Rachleff was Professor of Conducting at The University of Michigan where he conducted The University Concert Band, Chamber Winds and Contemporary Ensemble. There he also taught graduate courses in repertoire and conducting. His ensembles at Oberlin and Michigan have toured extensively in the United States and Europe, performing in major concert halls, and have received acclaim at performances at national and regional conventions of both the MENC and CBDNA. Professor Rachleff also served for two years as Director of Ensembles at The University of Connecticut, where he conducted The Wind Ensemble, Symphony Band and Opera Workshop, and headed the graduate instrumental conducting program. Also active in the area of commissioning and premiering new works, 20th Century composers Luciano Berio, Leslie Bassett, Warren Benson, Karl Husa, Ross Lee Finney, John Harbison, Bernard Rands, Morton Subotnik, George Crumb, Richard Wernick, Christopher Rouse and others have collaborated with Professor Rachleff in special projects. Professor Rachleff's college training career began at The University of Texas-Arlington, where he was twice nominated as the AMOCO Teacher of the Year in the Department of Music.

Professor Rachleff has conducted all-state bands, orchestras and festivals throughout the country, Italy, Switzerland, Canada and England. He has held week-long residencies at numerous institutions, including Rice University, Northwestern University, Michigan State University, The University of Texas, Interlochen Arts Academy and many others. His summers are often spent at the National Music Camp, Interlochen Center for the Arts, where he has conducted The University Sinfonietta, Festival Band and Orchestra, Chamber Winds, World Youth Orchestra and Symphonic Band. He was conductor for the 1985 All East MENC Symphony Band, and this year's guest schedule includes trips to Texas, Florida, New York, Missouri, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Michigan, Hawaii, Wisconsin, Connecticut, Arizona, Arkansas and again to Europe. In addition, Professor Rachleff has given lectures at several universities, published articles and presented papers at National Conventions. He has performed professionally with the Philadelphia Orchestra, Aspen Music Festival Orchestras, as well as with chamber ensembles throughout the country.

About the Conductor

Dr. Charles Argersinger is widely known as a jazz educator and composer of both jazz and contemporary classical music. Currently he is the Coordinator of Composition and Music Theory at Washington State University. He is in continual demand as a commissioned composer and arranger, and is published by Lou Fischer Publishing, UNC Press and Crown Music Press. Before his present position, he guided one of the premier jazz studies programs in the nation at DePaul University in Chicago, Illinois. His work with the DePaul Jazz Ensemble fostered a new leadership in the level of collegiate jazz ensemble performance much as the One O'Clock Lab Band of North Texas State University did in the sixties and seventies. His credits as a performer, arranger and conductor include work with Bill Evans, Barbara McNair, Dick Van Dyke, Donald O'Connor, Diahann Carroll, Glen Campbell, Gladys Knight and the Pips, Rich Little, Gordon McCrea, The Mills Brothers, Ray Bolger, Charlie Rich, Vikki Carr, Danny Thomas, and many others. Dr. Argersinger earned his bachelor and master of music degrees from Arizona State University, and his doctorate from the University of Minnesota.
