

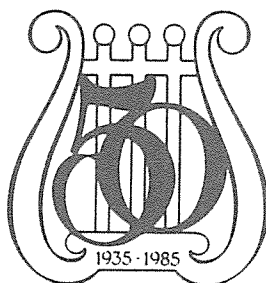

About the Conductor

Col. Arnald Gabriel (U.S.A.F. Ret.) is Chairman of the Department of Music at George Mason University. He is conductor of the GMU Symphony Orchestra and the McLean (VA) Orchestra.

Col. Gabriel retired from the U.S. Air Force in 1985, following a distinguished 36-year career. He served as commander-conductor of the internationally known U.S. Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra and The Singing Sergeants from 1964-1985. One of the world’s most widely traveled conductors, he has led bands and orchestras in all 50 of the United States and in 46 countries around the globe.

Among the hundreds of orchestras and bands Gabriel has conducted are the Minneapolis, Pittsburgh, San Antonio, Memphis, Florida, Glendale (California) and Fairfax (Virginia) Symphony Orchestras; the Carabinieri Band and the Air Force Band of Italy; the Royal Hellenic Band of Athens, Greece; the Staff Music Corps of Bonn, West Germany; the National Band of the Canadian Forces of Ottawa, Canada; and the Gamagori Band and the Tokyo Wind Orchestra of Japan.

Col. Gabriel was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Music degree in May 1989, by his alma mater, Ithaca College.

He continues to receive invitations to appear as guest conductor at major state, regional and university music festivals all over the world.

Niklaus Wyss - Conductor

About The Conductor

Niklaus Wyss, Associate Conductor of The Houston Symphony and Professor of Music at the University of Houston, was born in Zurich, Switzerland, where he earned diplomas in piano, harmony and counterpoint from the Konservatorium und Musikakkademie. He began his studies of conducting with Paul Mueller and in a special course under Hans Swarowski. Two master courses with Maestro Franco Ferrara in Hilversum, The Netherlands, brought an invitation by Ferrara (and a scholarship by the Italian government) for three years study at the Conservatorio di St. Cecilia in Rome. During summer breaks, studies continued under Mr. Ferrara in Venice (scholarships by the City of Venice). Conducting engagements followed in Zurich, Palermo, Catania, Trieste, and Milano.

In 1964, Mr. Wyss won first prize at the International Dimitri Mitropoulos Competition in New York and in 1965 was appointed as assistant conductor of the Toronto Symphony (Seiji Ozawa, music director.) In 1968, he went to Japan for special study with Hideo Saito, Mr. Ozawa's teacher. On returning to Europe, Mr. Wyss added opera and ballet to his conducting engagements and then in 1970 was appointed assistant conductor of the San Francisco Symphony, again with Ozawa as music director. While with that orchestra, his responsibilities included symphony concerts, a series of youth and community concerts, new music, and general programming.

Since 1975, Mr. Wyss has conducted extensively in Europe, the U.S. and Japan (including three seasons as principal conductor of the Kyoto Symphony). For six consecutive years, he conducted regularly all the ABC (Australian Broadcasting Co.) orchestras in Australia, in particular the Sidney, Melbourne and Brisbane orchestras, which he took on extended tours.

For several years he held the post of special adviser to Maestro Ozawa for the Boston Symphony and was the principal teacher of the conducting program at the Berkshire Music Center (Tanglewood) for two summers. In 1980 he was invited by Mr. Ozawa to conduct the first performance for the Boston Symphony of the complete Symphony No. 10 by Mahler, both in Boston and at Tanglewood.

In addition to his fulfilling guest conducting assignments, Mr. Wyss studies at the Center for Computer Research in Music and Acoustics at Stanford University, where he is currently working on a new piece for computer-generated sounds.

During his studies at Yale University, Tanglewood, Harvard, and Boston University, where he received his D.M.A. degree, Michael Horvit's composition teachers were Aaron Copland, Lukas Foss, Walter Piston, Quincy Porter, and Gardner Read. He is Head of the Theory and Composition Department at the University of Houston School of Music.

His works, many of which incorporate the electronic medium, range from solo instrumental and vocal works to large symphonic compositions and operas. They are available from several publishers, including C.F. Peters, Recital Publications, Shawnee Press, E.C. Schirmer Music Co., Southern Music Co., and Transcontinental Music Co.

Among the ensembles and individuals that have commissioned and premiered his works are the Houston Ballet, the Houston Symphony, the National Symphony of Mexico, the American Wind Symphony Orchestra, the Arkansas Symphony String Quartet, David Burge, and Temple Emanu El, Houston. His "Cullen Overture" was premiered in Houston in October 1988. His most recent large scale work, premiered in Chicago May 1989, is "Concerto for Brass and Orchestra," written on commission for the Chicago Chamber Brass.

Michael Horvit is co-author of three widely used theory texts published by Wadsworth Publishing Co. He is the recipient of awards from organizations that include B.M.I., ASCAP, the Martha Baird Rockefeller Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts, the Frigate Trust, and the University of Houston. "Circus Suite," for horn and piano, was recorded in January 1990 by Thomas Bacon and Brian Connely and will be released on CD later this year.
